Early Years Foundation Stage, EYFS

- National curriculum starts in Year 1
- EYFS is from birth to five years old
- We have a statutory framework to follow. This guidance changed in 2021.
- We also have non-statutory guidance to help us make up our curriculum; Development Matters and Birth to Five Matters.
- Early years settings and schools are not provided with a curriculum. We make our own curriculum based upon the needs of our children, how we can ensure they all achieve their full potential and that they are on track to meet their early learning goals at the end of reception.

Phonics Phase 1

The seven aspects we teach

- Environmental sounds
- Instrumental sounds
- Body percussion
- Rhythm and rhyme
- Alliteration
- Voice sounds
- <u>Oral</u> Blending and segmenting

Within each aspect there are three strands

- Auditory discrimination- tuning into sounds
- Auditory memory and sequencing listening and recalling sounds
- Developing vocabulary and language comprehension and
- Discriminating oral phonemes

Phonics, how to help at home

- Listen for sounds in the home and talk about them
- Listen for and notice sounds outside and talk about them
- Learn and sing together lots of nursery rhymes and songs
- Read lots of stories, especially books with rhythm and rhyme and talk about them
- Play with instruments together
- Mirror play making shapes with your mouth and sounds in the mirror
- Notice sounds you hear (not see) at the start of words

Maths, how to help at home

Play with maths is endless

- Bath time
- Cooking & baking, measuring weighing, counting, following a recipe
- Setting the table, how many today?
- Pairing clothes and shoes, what is a pair?
- Numbers in the environment, on your door, other doors, letterboxes,
- Toys, how many pieces in the puzzle, dice, board games, card games, matching, pick-a-pair
- Making lists
- Subertising, say what you see

Our fantastic children

- Are only three and four years old
- They are only little for a very short time
- Learning should be fun, an adventure and natural
- They are not meant to sit still
- They need good core strength to cope with school
- Getting ahead isn't best, getting the foundations right is!
